HUNTING

i. Hunting quotas

INFORMATION ONLY

A quota is issued to a hunter, concessionaire leasing land to the land holder. A quota has set number of animals to be hunted from a certain concession or land within a space of a calendar year. When harvesting one is not supposed to exceed the limit given on the quota.

ii. Primary hunting permits

A hunting permit is issued to a hunter, his or her agent, a concessionaire leasing land or the land holder. The hunting permit shows the name of the hunter or the property to be hunted, the animals to be hunted; their populations; sex and the amount paid for the hunting permit. The hunting permit is valid for a calendar year only. Animals shot; killed or wounded are considered harvested therefore they should be subtracted from the hunting permit. Animals not hunted by the last day of the validity of the permit cannot accumulate to the period following. **NB: You shall not exceed to harvest the population of species stated on the hunting permit or the species not included on the hunting permit.**

iii. Secondary hunting permits

- Special hunting permits – this is a notification to hunt which the Safari Operator in a specific area seeks from Zimparks. It involves using a sport hunting with a rifle. These are usually sought on species such as lions, leopards, and elephants. No payment is needed for these
- **Bow and arrow permits**

Payment of US\$1 500.00 is required to hunt on each property as requested by the Safari Operator

- **Hounds permits**

This is hunting wildlife using dogs. A dog registration receipt of US\$200 is paid annually if you are to hunt using dogs. Payment of US\$1 500.00 is required to hunt on each property as requested by the Safari Operator

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
